14. ****Attach a description of proposed senior thesis work, including background, purpose (i.e., main questions asked or hypotheses) procedures and methodology, and anticipated possible outcomes. Be specific about YOUR role in research, if working on a group project. Usually, two-three pages are sufficient. Write your thesis proposal clearly, keeping in mind that you are communicating with faculty from a variety of disciplines. If your research is highly technical, write a first paragraph that summarizes the project in jargon-free language that could be understood by people in other disciplines. Make sure that your proposal clearly indicates the nature of the product (e.g., paper, videotape, film, art portfolio, and computer program), and your source of data (e.g., laboratory data, interviews, observations of behavior, library research, statistical databases, and Internet sources) and references. You should work closely with your faculty sponsors when writing your proposal, and they should read and approve the final version.**

If your proposal is too vague, unfocused, and general, we are likely to request that you revise and resubmit your application at the next application deadline. Finally, be sure to check your thesis proposal carefully for typing, spelling and grammatical errors.

Be sure that letters from your supervisor/advisors briefly evaluate your proposed program research in addition to your course work. Students working with animal subjects need to read the booklet, complete the form associated with the Animal Contact program, and enclose a copy of the appropriate form. Students working with human participants may need to obtain approval of the Institutional Review Board. Students who come in contact with human pathogens must comply with the blood-borne pathogens program (e.g., hepatitis B shots). Check with your faculty sponsor about these regulations.
